Paul Jenkins

*Decontamination Manager,
North Bristol NHS Trust*

After training as a mechanical and electrical engineer, Paul became a service and test engineer for an autoclave manufacturer. Paul then joined a service company as test engineer for Gloucestershire NHS Trust and in 2000 he joined Eastwood Park Training Centre as a tutor, becoming the 'decontamination' department Manager in 2004.

Paul moved to the NHS two years ago and is now the Decontamination Manager for North Bristol NHS Trust, managing both Frenchay and Southmead Sterile Service Departments and advising the Trust on decontamination policies and protocols. Paul also trains and presents on decontamination issues related to re-usable medical devices.

Director of Infection Prevention and Control

Dr Adam Fraise graduated in Medicine at Newcastle University. He obtained membership of The Royal College of Pathologists and became a fellow in February 1998. After 4 years as a lecturer in Bacteriology at Oxford University, he was appointed as Director of the Hospital Infection Research Laboratory, Birmingham.

He is Honorary Senior Lecturer at Birmingham University and advises the UK Department of Health on microbiological matters as a member of the Medicines & Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) and is a member of the HPA Rapid Review Panel. He also works with the European Commission to develop disinfectant testing standards.
